I am teaching a course to these men that includes introductions to HTML, CSS, JavaScript, and jQuery. These men have no money to purchase books, and the prison education system, which is called the "Corrections Special School District" (CSSD), has no budget to purchase books for my class. In addition, there is no access to the Internet from inside the prison. It is true that each of the men in my class did something very wrong at some point that resulted in him being incarcerated, but to quote Bryan Stevenson, "Each of us is more than the worst thing we've ever done." As a retired Professor of Computer Science (University of Massachusetts Lowell, see my website at https://jesseheines.com), I am trying to help these men by enriching their lives through education. In my opinion, these men deserve such help even though they are prisoners. Quoting Stevenson once again, "The true measure of our character is how we treat the poor, the disfavored, the accused, the incarcerated, and the condemned.' Please support these efforts by donating books for these students. Thank you.


